

DURING A STORM JUNE 2023: STORM PREPAREDNESS


Every year, storms, including rain, tornadoes, lightning, hail, flash flooding and gale force winds, cause major destruction across Western Australia.

Here are five simple steps you can take to help protect your home.

- Trim branches to prevent them falling on your roof or car.
- Remove unused aerials and satellite dishes.
- Check and replace cracked, damaged or loose tiles.
- Clear gutters and downpipes of leaves and blockages.
- Have tarps and ropes on hand if needed.
